




- No central CMS

We staffed up

- Remote development help at first (Cheers, Adam!)
- We brought on content manager

One Big Multisite

- And a few stragglers
 - Daily campus news site
 - Online giving
 - Alumni Mentoring Buddypress
 - A few other randos

Why one multisite?



One theme to rule them all, One set of plugins to find them, One set of trainings to bring them all in, And in the darkness, bind them.

15 months later

 We moved 150 sites into WP, did a full content review of each one, and trained users



Then people started asking for stuff.

Special Stuff

- Faculty office hours
- LaTeX
- Different list item bullet styles
- A directory of alumni owned businesses
- And much more...

How do you deal with requests for new features or feature changes without

resorting to dozens of plugins?

This slide serves as a break to say that plugins aren't bad, but they add another layer of support, require additional training, and can be a new attack vector.





THE GREATER GOOD



LIMITING USER ROLES

All users are all editors

- They can't add, edit, or change themes
- They can't add or activate plugins
- We take buttons away in TinyMCE
- We hide all plugin nag screens (lookin' at you, Yoast)

We reviewed feedback and planned work

- Based on feedback, we created several custom post types
- Data and formatting can be consistent from site to site
- Only have to train on 1 tool

- As we rolled it for all academic departments, they sent more feedback, like we want areas of research, so we built it in.

THE JCU OPTIONS PANEL

The JCU Options panel

- This let us set theme variables on a site by site basis without needed tons of theme changes
- Number of news stories, image sliders, even the type list item bullet styles. Yes, bullet styles.
- Editors don't see this panel

PERFORMANCE ISSUES

When you are running 250+ sites on a machine with 4GB of RAM

"You're gonna have a bad time."



Some plugins caused massive overhead

Lookin' at you, Timely.

The server would get hammered, MySQL would run out of RAM, WP would start getting connection errors, and everything just failed, until a restart, at least of Apache and MySQL.

Sometimes, it would fail during its nightly backups and hang. I enjoyed getting Vigil notifications at 1:30 a.m. all the time.
